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Well 2020 certainly hasn't been a year anyone could have planned for. The global pandemic has had an effect on all of us to some extent. For HMF, it has placed us in a position where we have to re-think how we do things, not only in relation to our fundraising and delivery of our education programs, but also in relation to how we meet as a committee and how we provide patient support.

I am proud to say, that we have continued to deliver the sun safe and early detection message during the pandemic via our website and social media pages, and where possible and practical via live video conferences using Zoom.

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It's a really simple process, takes around 10 minutes and could save your life. If you notice anything new, or changes in anything old, then it's time to visit your skin check specialist or GP regardless of what's happening in the outside world. If you have concerns about visiting your GP, please take the time to have a tele health appointment so they can advise you on how to proceed.

We recommend checking your own skin at the change of every season, and undergoing a professional skin check at least once a year. If you have history of skin cancer, your Doctor will recommend more regular skin checks depending on your circumstances and medical history.

As we head into the warmer seasons of Spring and Summer and start to venture outdoors a little more, we're thinking about COVID-19 safety and social distancing, but it's important that we don't forget about our sun safety and skin care as well.

Remember to check the SunSmart app for your daily UV rating and apply sunscreen, hat, sunglasses, protective clothing whenever you're venturing outdoors, and remember to seek shade wherever possible.

As we get closer to the end of 2020 it's also a good time to remind you of our upcoming Annual General Meeting. This years AGM will be held via ZOOM conference on Monday 14th December at 6pm. We invite all of our members and potential members to attend regardless of whether they would like to hold a position. Further details on how to register attendance appear later in this newsletter.

Foundation News Claudia Tolhurst

It's been 6 months since our last newsletter, 6 VERY LONG months......and a lot has changed in that time as we all struggle our way through the global pandemic and find our way into the new normal.

The pandemic has forced many changes to our day to day lives, but one thing remains constant - our fight to defeat melanoma.

One of the issues Covid-19 brought with it, was a cancellation of skin check appointments. After discussing this with a local skin check clinic, I believe around 30% of patients cancelled their regular skin check during the height of the pandemic. If you were one of the 30%, please

Vale John Stevenson

John Stevenson was one of the first patients treated at the Newcastle Melanoma Unit when it was established at the old Wallsend Hospital in 1981. John's melanoma was on his back and required extensive surgery and follow up treatment. He always considered himself one of the lucky ones and made a commitment to raise awareness to melanoma in the Hunter Region (at that time considered a 'hot spot') and to support the Newcastle Melanoma Unit in appreciation of the care he received.

After talks with the Melanoma Unit doctors and staff John took on the task of forming the Hunter Melanoma Foundation – a charity that would solely support melanoma patients, staff, research and awareness and education in the Hunter.

John called a meeting of interested parties in mid 1980's and over 200 people attended. The Hunter Melanoma Foundation became an incorporated body and registered charity in May 1989.

Members of the Foundation, led by John and supported by his wife Verna, worked tirelessly to raise funds through dinner dances, monthly (and much appreciated) cake stalls at the Wallsend Campus, regular raffles, golf days and the annual Christmas



Fete. In particular they were actively involved in raising funds for two NBN Telethons – in 1989 and 1991 – these funds formed the basis of the funding for the Mater Institute where the Melanoma Unit is located.

John was passionate about raising awareness – especially to the importance of early detection in men over 50.

We owe a huge debt to John without whose foresight and hard work the HMF would not be the driving force it is today – still committed to melanoma - raising awareness, supporting staff and patients and research in our region.

John passed away in early May this year. Rest in peace John.



Again, the pandemic put a stop to our community awareness campaigns and as a result we have been raising awareness through digital means. As COVID restrictions start to ease, we will move our way back out into the community so that we can continue to reduce mortality rates from melanoma in the Hunter.

Spot Check

We are very excited to announce that we have received funding from two sources to run some much needed and potentially life saving skin check clinics here in the Hunter over the next 6 months.

With the financial support of Club Grants NSW - Western Suburbs (Newcastle) Leagues Club – we are delighted to be partnering with Hunter Surf Life Saving offering free Skin Check's one Sunday per month from November through to March to their members. The local Surf Life Saving community risk their lives on a regular basis to keep us all safe when we're at the beach and we are delighted to be able to offer this service to say thank you for the work you do

and return the favour by keeping them safe from the sun. Another grant from Novartis Australia, will allow us to offer the Spot Check program to the general public beach goers one Saturday each month over the same period.

We are very grateful to the Doctor's from Newcastle Skin Check who have volunteered their time to assist with Round 1 on the weekend of the 7th & 8th of November. Further dates are to be confirmed and announced on our Facebook page and website in the coming weeks.


Nova Alliance Bank have also provided us with funding to provide each skin check patient with co-branded sunscreen samples.

Practice What You Preach

Unfortunately, that led to many days of red raw sunburn, blistering, peeling and definitely no tan for me. The 'old wive's tail' treatment for sunburn was a nice hot bath filled with vinegar. Imagine treating a burn with that these days?

As a result of that teenage behaviour, my family history and my role here at HMF, I am very diligent when it comes to checking my own skin. I'm always on the lookout for new spots or changes to existing spots and check my skin at the change of season, every 3 months. My annual skin check is due around July/August each year and I make sure I make the appointment when I get the reminder.

I attended Newcastle Skin Check in August, for my annual appointment, thinking there were no issues, because I hadn't noticed any changes. Unfortunately, I was wrong. Dr Azzi found a Basal Cell Carcinoma on my face sitting inside an existing scar that hade been there for many years.

The moral to the story

- 1. Even if you're diligent with your self skin checks, it really does pay to have a professional take a look on at least an annual basis, and
- 2. Look after your skin now so you don't pay for it later in life

David Wallace

You may remember back in the November newsletter last year, we shared the story of David Wallace. David was standing in line at the St George Bank, Kotara, between Christmas and New Year 2018, when the guy behind him gave him a tap on the shoulder and alerted him to a spot on his arm which turned out to be an aggressive melanoma.

David had the melanoma (not his first) removed within the fortnight and we shared his story in an effort to find the "Hero" that alerted him to the spot. Despite the attention the story got on our social media pages and newsletter we have never located the Hero in David's story.

Unfortunately, David's story doesn't end there.

In April this year, David was being treated for what was thought to be a bladder infection. After not responding to antibiotics, further investigation led to a diagnosis of bladder cancer in early May.

In early June, David had surgery to remove a 28mm tumour from his bladder, later that month the tumour was confirmed to be an invasive melanoma.

A PET scan in early July found that the melanoma was also in David's Gall Bladder.

During this time, David also had two further melanomas removed from his arm and his buttocks.


On the 21st of July, David was diagnosed with Stage IV melanoma and an MRI a week later confirmed that the melanoma had metastasized to his brain where he now had 10 tumours.

David started immunotherapy treatment at the Calvary Mater Newcastle on 7th August and has completed 3 treatment cycles with his 4th due this week (9th October).

David is a well known Referee in the Newcastle & Hunter Rugby Union community and prior to COVID was working with HMF on a Melanoma awareness and fundraising round of local rugby. He continues to work towards that goal for next season and we look forward to helping him achieve it.

David has labelled himself the "HMF Poster Boy" and is allowing us to continue to share his story in the hope that it raises awareness about the importance of sun protection, prevention and early detection of melanoma.

We know the HMF community will be behind David and his family as he continues on his melanoma treatment path, and we thank him for allowing us to be a part of that journey. 
