Back in 2023, the Hunter Melanoma Foundation received funding to launch a pilot program -



the Sun-Safe Workplace Awareness Program (SWAP). This specialised training initiative was designed to improve sun safety knowledge among outdoor workers, who face a higher risk of developing melanoma and other skin cancers due to the nature of their work.

Since that initial pilot, we've been quietly working behind the scenes to refine the program and prepare it for a broader rollout. Our goal has always been to secure the funding needed to deliver SWAP in a more formal and sustainable way - and now, that goal is becoming a reality.

Thanks to a generous donation from the Farrelly family, we are delighted to welcome Sue-Ellen Evans to the HMF team as Project Manager of the SWAP Program. Sue-Ellen brings extensive experience in national program management, workforce development, and stakeholder engagement across aged care, disability, and community services. She has led large-scale government initiatives, built strong partnerships with industry and community organisations, and delivered training programs that create real impact. With a proven track record in shaping workforce reform and driving positive change, Sue-Ellen is well-placed to lead the SWAP Program into its next exciting chapter.



Melanoma News

For the past few years, the Hunter Melanoma Foundation has proudly been part of the Australian Melanoma & Skin Cancer Alliance (AMSCA). This nationwide network brings together people, researchers. and health professionals who share



one goal - to improve the lives of those affected by melanoma and skin cancer. By working side-by-side with others across the sector, we can share knowledge, strengthen our voice, and make a greater impact for our community.

As a member of AMSCA, I feel privileged to be connected with incredible, like-minded people whose passion for defeating melanoma matches my own. Right now, the Melanoma Institute Australia is leading the way in developing a roadmap for a targeted national melanoma screening program - something our country currently lacks. With melanoma being the second most commonly diagnosed cancer in the Hunter New England Local Health District, and seeing firsthand the positive impact of our own Spot Check Clinics, we are proud to contribute our knowledge and local insights to help shape this important national initiative.

We are also privileged to contribute to the work of MSCAN and the Australian College of Dermatologists as they develop a national Skin Cancer Scorecard. This scorecard will serve as an evidence-based roadmap for advancing melanoma and skin cancer advocacy across Australia, while amplifying the voices of consumers, clinicians, researchers, and advocates.

As a small but mighty charity with a strong focus on our local community, it's inspiring to be part of these significant national initiatives - knowing that our local experience can help drive change on a much larger scale.

We're delighted to welcome Arabella Tarpey as the newest ambassador for the Hunter Melanoma Foundation. As a melanoma survivor, Arabella brings passion, energy, and a strong commitment to raising awareness about melanoma prevention and early detection. Our Impact

At the end of each financial year, we take time to reflect on the past 12 months and prepare an Impact Statement. This helps us stay focused on our goals and measure our progress against our strategic plan. We're proud to share this with you our members, donors, and supporters - so you can see the real difference your generosity makes in our community.

In the last 12 months we have held 6 Spot Check clinic days, providing free skin checks to 620 people in our community. During these clinics doctors identified 91 suspicious spots that required further investigation - including 12 suspected melanomas.

The Spot Check clinics remain our most important and impactful program - saving lives through early detection. But the impact doesn't stop there. Each melanoma detected and treated before it reaches Stage IV saves the health system an estimated \$187,000 per patient. That means, in the last year alone, our clinics have not only saved lives but have also saved the health system approximately \$2.224 million.

Educating the community about the prevention and early detection of melanoma is also a core part of our work at HMF. Over the past 12 months, we have delivered 29 education sessions to schools, workplaces, and community groups, and taken part in seven community activations to spread the sunsafe message even further.

Our patient support services also remain at the heart of what we do. In the past year, we have provided 50 instances of practical or emotional support to 25 patients, helping them and their families navigate the challenges of a melanoma diagnosis.

Thanks to your continued support, we're able to deliver these programs, provide vital services, and make a real difference in our community. Together, we are helping to prevent melanoma, detect it earlier, and support those affected every step of the way.

In The Community

We've been proud to take our message out into the community through a number of key activations. At Surfest, we had the opportunity to partner with the Port of Newcastle and connect with beachgoers and surf enthusiasts, sharing important sun safety advice while providing sunscreen and resources to help keep our community protected. Our new VISIA UV Camera proved to be popular (in some cases unpopular when the results were delivered). The camera shows the UV damage to your skin that isn't visible to the naked



eye. It is a great conversation starter and raises awareness of why sun safety is so important.

We were also able to deliver skin checks to the Newcastle Knights, ensuring players and staff could prioritise their skin health while inspiring fans to do the same. Continuing our outreach, we partnered with Hunter Homeless Connect to deliver free skin checks to some of our most vulnerable community members, making early detection more accessible to everyone. Thanks to Dr Tony Azzi from Newcastle Skin Check for donating his time to make these two events possible.

These activations and the many more we do each year, highlight our commitment to being where the community is - raising awareness, encouraging prevention, and supporting early detection of melanoma across the Hunter region.
