Spring into action to protect your skin.

Spring is one of my favourite seasons......warm days, cool nights slowly building in to the summer months. As we come out of hibernation due to winter and lockdown it's a great time to start thinking about your summer skin care routine.

Here are a few tips we've put together to help get you started :

LSELF SKIN CHECK

When was the last time your performed a self skin check ? We recommend you check your skin at the beginning of each season. If you missed checking your skin at the beginning of Spring, now would be a great time to take 10 minutes to look after yourself. Don't forget summer is just around the corner, so set a reminder in your phone or diary to check again on the 1st December. If you need help, you can check out the video on our website. If you see something new, changing or unusual, make an appointment with your Doctor.

2. BOOK A SKIN CHECK

We know a lot of skin check and other health appointments were skipped during lockdown. When was the last time you had your skin checked by a professional? We recommend you have a professional skin check at least once every year. Your Doctor will advise if they need to see you more regularly. Pick up the phone, and make that booking today.

3. CHECK YOUR SUNSCREEN

Did you know that sunscreen has an expiry date ? Check your stock of sunscreen now and make sure it is still in date. If not, throw it away and buy some more to ensure you stay protected. We have our own branded sunscreen available via our online shop and have some great specials

available leading into summer.

4. DOWNLOAD THE SUNSMART APP

The SunSmart app is free and a great tool to alert you to WHEN to protect your skin. Daily alerts advise what the predicted UV reading is for the day and the times during the day when sun protection is required. If the UV is above 3, you need protection.

5. COVER UP

Make sure you always have a wide brimmed hat, long sleeved shirt and sunglasses on when you're out in the sun. Wear sunscreen and re-apply every 2 hours and don't forget to protect your eyes with sunglasses.



WHERE IT BEGAN

The HMF Gimme 5! money box campaign was created in memory of Scott Polglase, who lost his battle with melanoma in 2006 at the age of 28. One of Scott's quirks was his aversion to five cent pieces. He would empty them out of his wallet at every opportunity. To honour his memory his family began the five cent collection to help HMF in their mission to defeat the disease that took their much loved husband, son & brother.

The idea expanded beyond Scott's family, and we were able to print special money boxes to hand out in the community at every opportunity. Today, 15 years later, we still hand the money boxes out and will continue to do so. This campaign is a perfect example of how a little from many can add up to a lot for one. In fact, the campaign to date has raised more than \$47,000 – that's a lot of five cent pieces.

WHY THE CHANGE.....

With the removal of five cent pieces from the economy rumoured to be on the horizon, and in consultation with Scott's family, we decided to re-vamp the Gimme 5! Campaign to ensure Scott's legacy continues for many years to come.

HOW DOES IT WORK.....

Gimme 5! Is now an annual event to be held in October, where participant's sign up to complete 5 activities per week or 5 in total for the month. The activity can be absolutely anything ! This year we had a lot of people walking and/or running, but we also had people reading, singing new songs, doing yoga classes, and various other activities. HMF Executive Officer, Claudia Tolhurst, completed 5 Random Acts of Kindness as her Gimme 5 activity.

Participants were encouraged to obtain sponsorship donations for their activities, and at the time of writing this newsletter, the Gimme 5! Campaign has been a great success with over \$20,000 raised.

We had a range of people sign up including melanoma patients, melanoma survivors, families who have been affected by melanoma, and even Newcastle's Super Star Drag Queen, Timberlina, who alone raised more than \$2400.

The planned corporate side of Gimme 5! was impacted by the COVID-19 lockdown and we were forced to make some last minute changes to ensure it could be held. In total we had 10 teams registered including 4 from Quarry Mining, and one each from Just Dig Deeper, Beyond Bank, Broadley Signs, BNI Action, Newcastle Skin Check and Niche Real Estate & Property Solutions.

An event like this doesn't happen





without the support of local businesses through sponsorship, and we were lucky to have some of the best sponsors on board in Genesis Fitness, Niche Real Estate & Property Solutions and H Events.

Spot Check Update

Thanks to the team at Novartis Pharmaceuticals, we have secured funding to continue with our Spot Check clinics this year. The Covid-19 pandemic and subsequent lock down has made the planning of this or any event difficult, but we are now moving forward with planning. Dates will be advertised on our website and social media pages, so keep an eye out if you want to take advantage of a free skin check.

Thanks to continued funding from The West's Group through the NSW Club Grants scheme, we are in a position to take a pilot of the Spot Check program into the Workplace this year, and look forward to seeing the results.

We were also delighted to receive a share of the \$40,000 in community grant funding from NOVA Alliance Bank.

Since their establishment in 1964 as a local credit union, NOVA Alliance Bank has proudly supported a range of local charities with their grant program.

NOVA Alliance Bank CEO, David Franklin, said that the Board with the support of staff and members agreed



that providing personalised grants to support local community programs was an important but vital change to this year's grant structure.

"With the devastation of COVID-19, we re-evaluated our grants program to determine how we could make a difference that counted," David said.

"Instead of providing a fixed grant to all recipients, we took the time to evaluate each program, the resources required, and the funds that would see the best possible social outcomes. "We are hopeful that these personalised grants will not only help community groups and charities to drive positive change in the community, but to inspire others to do the same."

This funding allows HMF to purchase co-branded sunscreen samples to hand out at the Spot Check clinics and contributes to education on the prevention of melanoma.




7 Membership


